



Fillmore to get 64 new units of affordable housing
PSHH introduces newest neighborhood at Community Meeting

Fillmore, Ventura County, CA, September 23, 2019 – For nearly 30 years, Peoples’ Self-Help Housing has been supporting the community of Ventura County through home ownership, rental development and homeless placement programs.

The organization is now expanding its service area with the development of the 64-unit Fillmore Terrace. In order to introduce this newest neighborhood to the community, a family friendly event with dinner and childcare is being offered at the Active Adult Center, located at 533 Santa Clara Avenue in Fillmore. on Wednesday, September 25th from 5:30 -7:30pm. Spanish translation will also be available.

“The construction of Fillmore Terrace sees us building on nearly thirty years of service in Ventura County,” said PSHH President/CEO John Fowler. “Along with the much-needed housing, the property will also bring our signature site-based services along with in-house property management and a cadre dedicated case management staff.”

About Fillmore Terrace

The new community of Fillmore Terrace will have 64 one-, two-, and three- bedroom units. Serving income-eligible individuals and families, the development will also have a community center and kitchen, onsite learning center, and interior courtyard. Each unit will take advantage of energy and water-efficient appliances and all residents will benefit from secure parking.
